

Manx Grand Prix & Classic TT Road Races 2017



ROADS CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC

Notice is given that the Manx Grand Prix and Classic TT Road Races Authorisation 2017 will permit the organiser (Manx Motor Cycle Club Ltd) to hold practices, races and parades during the Festival of Motorcycling period.

1. MOUNTAIN ROAD TWO-WAY TRAFFIC

The Mountain Road will be open to **TWO-WAY** traffic during the Festival. Cycling will also be prohibited for safety reasons between Ramsey Hairpin and Creg ny Baa Back Road from **9.30 a.m.** on **Friday 18 August 2017** until **4.30 p.m.** on **Monday 4 September 2017**.

2. ROADS CLOSED

The main roads known as the TT COURSE will be CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC for the 2017 Manx Grand Prix and Classic TT Road Races as follows -

3. DELAYED AND POSTPONED RACES

In the event of adverse weather conditions etc. the start of any race, including a parade, may be delayed.

Note: Tuesday to Friday of Race Week - if racing is not completed, then the entire course will re-open to traffic between 5.00pm and 6.00pm.

4. Notification of delayed and postponed closures will be given in the news bulletins on local radio.

5. CROSSING PLACES AND ACCESS CORRIDORS

In any interval, the Clerk of the Course may authorise traffic to cross or proceed along the course at the places specified below, at such times as they may specify:-

- Douglas, St Ninians crossroads between Ballaquayle Road and Ballanard Road
- Douglas, Bottom of Bray Hill between Stoney Road and Tromode Road
- Douglas, Peel Road between the Quarterbridge and Strang Road, Union Mills
- Crosby, between Old Church Road, Eyreton Road and Ballavitchel Road
- Michael, Barregarrow crossroads
- Kirk Michael, between Douglas Road Corner and Faaie ny Cabbal
- Ballaugh, between Station Road and Glen Road
- · Lezayre, Sulby Glen crossroads
- Ramsey, between Glen Auldyn and Gardeners Lane
- Ramsey, between Christian Street and Westbourne Road
- Ramsey, between Lheaney Road and Barrule Park
- Onchan, between Signpost Corner and Bedstead Corner
- Onchan and Douglas, between Governor's Road, Victoria Road and Second Avenue

6. ACCESS ROAD TO THE INSIDE OF THE TT COURSE

Restricted vehicular access to the inside of the course, including Noble's Hospital, will be maintained for cars and small vans below 3,500kg and under 3.35m in height. This is available via the A5 New Castletown Road near its junction with Quarterbridge roundabout. The Access Road is narrow with passing places and so traffic is controlled. Pedestrian access is prohibited for safety reasons.

7. ROADS OPEN

The TT Course will be re-opened for traffic by an official motor vehicle displaying a notice "Roads Open" proceeding along the Course upon the completion of the races, and by the passing of such vehicle the part of the course so passed is open for traffic.

8. YOU MUST NOT ENTER A CLOSED ROAD

It is an offence to enter or remain on a road that has been closed. This includes the footways. It is also an offence to enter or remain in a **Prohibited** or **Restricted Area** during road closure periods.

Please respect the Marshals advice - they are trying to keep you safe.

9. TEMPORARY SPEED LIMITS


Temporary speed limits will be introduced on some sections of the course for the Festival period. Speed limits will be indicated by signage – not paying attention to the signage is not a defence.
